The Mass will be celebrated in Columbus Civic Centre Chapel by the Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, council chaplain, at 9 A. M. on February 22.

Intention of the Mass as outlined by Judge Martin J. Fay of Yonkers, Chairman of the State War Activities Committee, is in memory of the honored dead of the present war and for safety of the men now serving in the armed forces.

Past Grand Knight Joseph P. Flynn of Rochester Council has been appointed diocesan chairman of K. of C. War activities and he, with Chairman Eugene F. McFarland of Rochester Council's committee, is directing arrangements for attendance at the Mass.
