Catholic Labor College

Ideals of Reconstruction Discussed by Father Vogt

The Rochester Catholic Labor College held the third regular session on Friday evening at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 602 South Ave. The Rev. George C. Vogt, M.A., diocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, continued his discussion

of Ideals of Reconstruction. This is the sixth in a series of ten pamphlets on The Social Question by Dom Virgil Michel.

The chapter under discussion is concerned with the common good. Father Michel declares that the individualistic concept of the common good is inadequate and unjust. He says, "According to individualism, a society of men is not an organic entity, but an aggregation, or a heaping up of individuals; there is no further existence to society than such an external putting together of individual human units. Hence there is no wonder that the ethics of utilitarianism spoke of the common good as merely the greatest good of the greatest majority."

Since, however, the logical outcome of individualism is the concentration of wealth in the hands of the few, the principle of the greatest possible good of the greatest possible majority means in practice the ever greater good of the favored few.

The discussion which followed was concerned with practical remedies for the obvious failure of finance-capitalism to secure the common good. The three principal plans advanced were: a movement back to the land; decentralization of industry and the means of production; and voluntary cooperation. All of these will receive fuller treatment in succeeding sessions of the Labor College.

The main economic advantages of a back to the land movement are that a farm gives a man economic security by supplying him with the basic necessities of life; and it frees him from the control of those who have concentrated the means of production in their hands. This concentration of wealth is bad and destructive of the common good, whether that concentration be in the hands of a "few rich people" or of the State. Two books recommended for further reading on this subject are: Democracy's Second Chance by George Boyle, and Rural Roads to Security by Monsignor Luigi G. Ligutti.

Father Vogt announced that he will continue his discussions of the principles that "should guide us in reconstructing the social order" at the next session of the Labor College. Anyone interested is invited to come and take part in the discussions.

Lt. Daley of Auburn 'Killed in Action'

AUBURN. — First Lieutenant William Charles Daley of the United States Army was killed in action on Jan. 11, 1943. The lieutenant's father is Lieut.-Col. George W. Daley now stationed at Camp Crowder, Missouri, and Mrs. Daley is with the Colonel.

No details in regard to Lieutenant Daley's death were received in Auburn.

Lieutenant Daley is a graduate of St. Mary's School, and of the Auburn Senior High School. He was employed at the Hewitt drug store before leaving for Fort McClellan, Alabama, in the fall of 1940 with the Service Company of the 100th Regiment, National Guard.

Daley was a private when he enlisted with Uncle Sam but was promoted to the rank of Corporal and then to Sergeant. He was commissioned a second lieutenant while in Hawaii.
