SIX GIRL SCOUT TROOPS TO MARK ANNIVERSARY

Ch. Nolan Reports On War Salvage Drives

Planning to extend its war-time efforts in 1943, the Rochester Salvage Committee has made a report of activities during 1942 which covers extensive work done in salvaging scrap metal, paper, rubber and tin for the war industries.

The report signed by William T. Nolan, chairman covers the period from Feb. 3, 1942, when Mayor Samuel B. Dickel called the first meeting.

Prominent and patriotic citizens took part in arranging and carrying out the various successful campaigns.

Highlights of the campaigns conducted are:

Scrap Metal Drive at April 28, 1942, brought in a total of 1,000 tons of scrap metal for which the committee received \$13,749.40, which was turned over to the City Treasurer.

Paper and Rubber Drive of June 24, 1942 resulted in a total of 24,000 pounds of scrap rubber with \$2,368.90 turned over to the City Treasurer.

Tin Can Collection - Aug. 27, Oct. 10 and Dec. 6, Net results of these drives amounted to nearly 387 gross tons of tin cans for which a check for \$1,071.34 was turned over to the City Treasurer. The committee also received and paid \$117.50 to towns in surrounding area for tin turned in on the drive.

Scrap Metal Drive presented by the newspapers and held on Oct. 24, 1942, brought in approximately 3,800 tons of scrap metal.

The success of these various drives has resulted from the combined efforts of so many people that it is impossible in this report to give credit in the many places where it is due," the report states.

Special thanks are extended to the press and radio for cooperation and to the Rev. Charles J. Mahoney of the Catholic schools and James Morgan of the public schools, and to the committee members and office staff who cooperated.

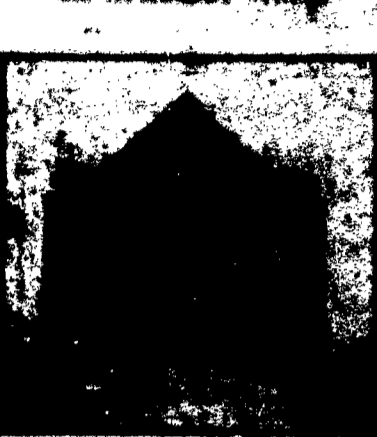
