

## New Guinea Missionaries Safe, Maier Family Hears

Comforting information for relatives of Society of the Divine Word missionaries in New Guinea, one of whom is Sister M. Theophane nee Inez Maier of Rochester, was received this week from the Rev. Bruno Hugspiel, S.V.D., mission procurator, Techy, Ill.

Sister Theophane is at St. Michael's mission in New Guinea. The letter from the Mission Procurator was sent to her brothers, Rufus, Gerard and Raymond Maier in Rochester.

Father Hugspiel quotes from a letter received from Father Arthur Manion, a missionary of the Society of the Divine Word. The letter written from Kariru, Weewak, T.M.Z., and dated Dec. 9, 1942 was addressed to his mother.

In his letter Father Manion states:

"Don't think we have been much affected. The nearest I got to this war was today when I contacted two gasoline tanks, one from an American and the other from a Japanese plane."

The two tanks had floated to one of our shores from a scene

of war.
