Rochester joins some 2,000 communities throughout the United States in the observance of Brotherhood Week, February 18-28.

The Rochester Inter-Faith Goodwill Committee is sponsoring the local observance as part of the nation-wide program under the auspices of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

Highlight of the week's observance will be the Inter-Faith Luncheon Wednesday, February 24th at 12:15 P. M. at the Chamber of Commerce. Representatives of the three faiths will address the meeting. They are: Rev. Harry Taylor, First Presbyterian Church, Syracuse; Rabbi Benjamin Friedman, Temple Society of Concord, Syracuse; Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, Holy Rosary Church, Rochester.

Clergymen of the city are devoting their sermons to the theme "Victory for Brotherhood" in the synagogues, Friday evening, February 18th, and in the churches on Sunday, February 21st. Several radio programs featuring speakers of Catholic, Protestant and Jewish faiths are scheduled over stations WHAM, WHEC, and WSAY during Brotherhood Week.

In commending Brotherhood Week President Roosevelt said, "I commend to all our citizens the observance of Brotherhood Week, February 18th to 28, 1943. I like the slogan 'Victory for Brotherhood.' I trust that the call of the National Conference of Christians and Jews to affirm anew the religious principles of understanding, justice, friendliness and co-operation on which the realization of brotherhood rests will be heeded by those of every occupation and religious allegiance. It is the application of these principles that makes our country strong and unified."
