## German Move To Enroll Norway Youth

WASHINGTON—Continually lobbied by misled, vigorous opposition from churches, teachers, parents and children themselves, the Nazis are planning a new move to enroll or force Norwegian children into their youth movement, according to advice received here by the Royal Norwegian Information Service.

The reports state that the "youth service" is about to be launched on an extensive basis and large printings of questionnaires have been made by the Nazis to enroll children into their "Gestapuyouth" (youth movement).
