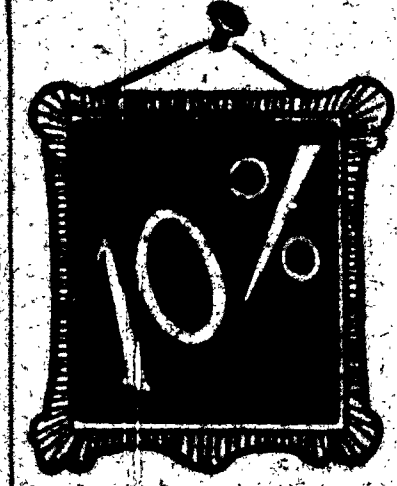
Stamp Sales Started

A Message To Boys and Young Men

IN MANY PARTS of the world red-blooded American young men are fighting for all of us here at home. They stand ready to give their very lives if need be. They are fighting to make this world a decent place in which to live for years to come. It takes plenty of ammunition, planes, tanks, guns and bombs to get these American boys over there and keep them fully supplied with the sinews of war. That's why we cannot afford to waste anything here at home in the way of vital raw materials.

Because of these facts, it is difficult to believe information recently released by the Rochester War Council, yet it is true. The facts are that during the month of January, 1945, scrap metal was needed in Rochester. This represents a form of waste which has reached alarming proportions. It drains vital materials such as copper and tin from the manufacture of steel tanks and necessitates the allocation of vitally necessary manpower, which could otherwise be kept on actual war work, to recycle discarded globes daily.

We therefore ask that all red-blooded Americans do what they can to prevent the continuation of this wasteful waste brought about by the practice of thoughtless boys and young men. They use vital materials and then leave them scattered about, unrecycled, unrecycled, unrecycled.
