

Missionary Says Mass In Street Since New Parish Has No Church

LA PAZ, Bolivia.—La Razón, Bolivian daily, has published a significant description of the Mass which one of the recently arrived Maryknoll Missionaries celebrated in the open air at the receding of two streets in the newly established town of Villa Victoria in the Diocese of La Paz.

The accompanying illustration showed picturesque background of the mud huts of a native village. In one corner resting against the wall of dark bricks stands a sim-

ple altar around which the townspeople kneel. "The Diocese of La Paz," the article said "recently created the Parish of Villa Victoria and placed it in the care of priests of the Maryknoll Mission. These priests, who have just arrived in this country, have taken charge in their new parish which does not have a church. But Masses are said on the improvised altar on Sundays and Holy Days at the corner formed by Virrey Toledo and Gonzalez Flor Streets.

Too Much Anti-Reich Propaganda In Norway Decried

WASHINGTON.—Teachers and clergy in occupied Norway are spreading an "unlimited amount of 'sneaky, pro-British propaganda,' writing against the Axis Powers" despite official orders to the contrary, according to a complaint made by a Danish newspaper, *Fredningsbladet*, which is Nazi controlled. War Training Schools Revise War Schedule

The recent order issued by Paul V. McNair, War Manpower Commission head, setting up a list of non-deferrable jobs resulted in a revised schedule of classes in the Rochester war training schools.

Announced by Verne A. Bird, Assistant Superintendent of Schools and Director of Vocational Training for War Production, the new schedule was effective Monday, Feb. 15.

At Edison Technical and Industrial High School the following courses are listed: 8:00 A. M. to 4:30 P. M., machine shop and inspection inspection; 8:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M., blue print reading, industrial chemistry and machine shop; 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M., automatic screw machine, aviation ground school, blue print reading, drafting, electrical work, industrial chemistry, light assembly, machine shop, ordnance inspection, pattern making, radio communications, sheet metal, tool and die making, tool design, and welding; and from 10:00 P. M. to 6:30 A. M., aviation ground school, machine shop, ordnance inspection, sheet metal and welding.

The schedule at Vocational High School includes inspection practice, light assembly and radio communications from 8:00 A. M. to 4:30 P. M.; parachute making from 3:30 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.; electricity, inspection practice, light assembly, machine shop, parachute making, radio communications, and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

The Paul Revere Trade School program now lists aircraft fabrication, welding and light assembly from 8:00 A. M. to 4:30 P. M.; light assembly from 3:00 P. M. to 6:00 P. M.; and auto mechanics, blue print reading, drafting, electricity, glider construction, light assembly, machine shop, and gas welding from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

From 6:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M., the program at Benjamin Franklin High School has scheduled aviation ground school, light assembly and machine shop; and from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M., aviation ground school, blue print reading, electricity, light assembly, machine shop, pattern making, sheet metal and electric welding.

The new Madison High School schedule lists light assembly from 3:00 P. M. to 6:00 P. M., and blue print reading and drafting, instrument reading, light assembly, machine shop, radio communications and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

Monroe High School is listing light assembly from 3:00 P. M. to 6:30 P. M., and aviation ground school, blue print reading, drafting, electricity, light assembly, machine shop and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

At Jefferson High School, courses in aviation ground school, glider construction, machine shop and sheet metal are scheduled from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

John Marshall High School and East High School have mapped light assembly programs from 3:00 P. M. to 6:00 P. M. and evenings from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

Pittsford High School and Rush High School have listed classes in light assembly from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M. with a light assembly class scheduled at Penfield High School from 3:15 P. M. to 6:45 P. M.

Persons interested in applying for immediate training can register directly at the schools and can be assigned to classes the same day.

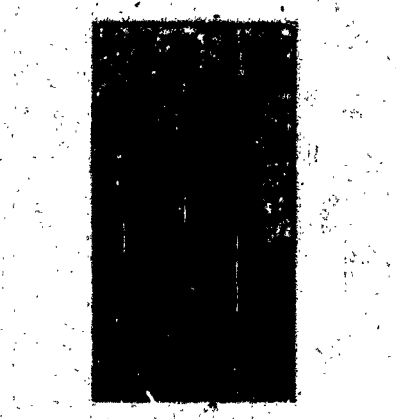

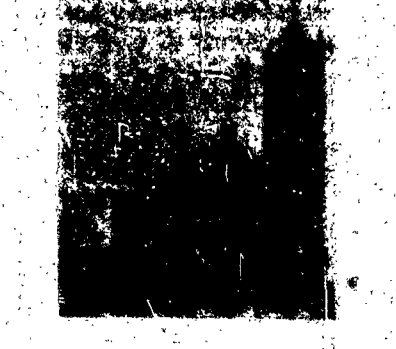
