Canadian Nuns Held In Japanese Camp

HALIFAX, N. S. — Sisters of the Order of the Sacred Heart, who conduct a convent and girls' school here, have learned that some of the nuns of their community, formerly stationed here, are in a Japanese concentration camp. They were at a school for girls in Tokyo when the war broke out.

Although the names of the interned nuns were not disclosed, Mother M. Brady and Mother C. MacFarlane, it is known, were at the Japanese school and now are presumed to be in a concentration camp.

War Training Schools Revise War Schedule

The revised order issued by Paul V. McNeil, War Manpower Commission here, setting up a list of non-deferrable jobs resulted in a revised schedule of classes in the Rochester war training schools.

Announced by Yvonne A. Wolf, Assistant Superintendent of Schools and Director of Vocational Training for War Production, the new schedule was effective Monday, Feb. 11.

At Edison Technical and Industrial High School the following courses are listed: 8:30 A. M. to 1:30 P. M., machine shop and machine inspection; 1:30 P. M. to 5:00 P. M., blue print reading, industrial chemistry and machine shop; 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M., automatic screw machine, machine ground school, blue print reading, drafting, electrical work, industrial chemistry, light assembly, machine shop, machine inspection, sheet metal and welding.

The schedule at Vocational High School includes inspection practice, light assembly and radio communications from 8:30 A. M. to 1:30 P. M.; parachute making from 1:30 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.; electricity, inspection practice, light assembly, machine shop, parachute making, radio communications, and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

The Paul Revere Trade School program now lists aircraft fabrication, welding and light assembly from 8:30 A. M. to 1:30 P. M.; light assembly from 1:30 P. M. to 5:00 P. M.; and auto mechanics, blue print reading, drafting, electricity, glider construction, light assembly, machine shop, and gas welding from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

From 2:00 P. M. to 5:00 P. M., the program at Benjamin Franklin High School has scheduled aviation ground school, light assembly and machine shop; and from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M., aviation ground school, blue print reading, electricity, light assembly, machine shop, pattern making, sheet metal and electric welding.

The new Madison High School schedule was light assembly from 8:30 P. M. to 1:30 P. M., and blue print reading and drafting, instrument reading, light assembly, machine shop, radio communications, and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

Monroe High School is listing light assembly from 8:30 P. M. to 1:30 P. M. and aviation ground school, blue print reading, drafting, electricity, light assembly, machine shop and sheet metal from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

At Jefferson High School, courses in aviation ground school, glider construction, machine shop and sheet metal are scheduled from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

John Marshall High School and East High School have mapped light assembly programs from 8:30 P. M. to 1:30 P. M. and evenings from 7:00 P. M. to 10:00 P. M.

Fittsford High School and Wash High School have listed classes in light assembly from 7:30 P. M. to 10:00 P. M. with a light assembly class scheduled at Fittsford High School from 1:15 P. M. to 5:45 P. M.

Persons interested in applying for immediate training can register directly at the schools and can be assigned to classes the same day.

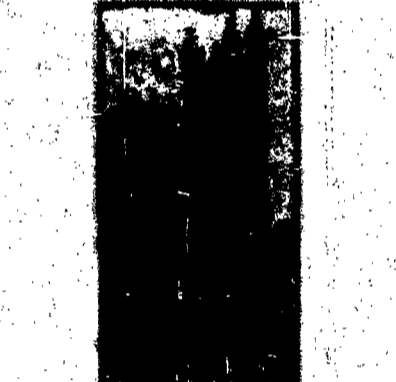
