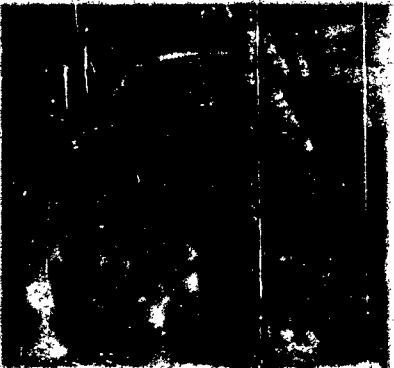

Girl Scout Leader To Work With Youth In Diocese

NEW YORK.—Two members of the staff of the Girl Scouts, Inc. have been assigned to work with Catholic groups in the organizing and effective functioning of Girl Scout groups in the New York-New Jersey area.

- That there is a growing need and opportunity for Catholic Social Workers.

-That such graduates in May, 1943, will have at least three months' training for jobs before graduation.
-That a graduate of the National Catholic School of Social Service will have a fellow Alumna in practically every large city and Diocese in the United States.
-That the Girl Scouts of America, American Red Cross and others offer generous scholarships toward the second year's training to students who have completed one year.
-That a number of Archdioceses and Dioceses have made provisions for scholarships which will cover the expenses in part or in whole at the National Catholic School of Social Service.
-That the National Council of Catholic Women has supported and sponsored the school since its origin 22 years ago and each year assists many students in graduate training.
-That public and private agencies in Washington, D. C. and in Baltimore cooperate with the school for training in the professional fields of group, family, child, psychiatric and medical social work.
-That according to authorities, the world of the future will demand that each person make a social contribution according to his ability, and you can combine your spiritual and social contribution with a professional social work career.
-That information on the National Catholic School of Social Service, its faculty, curriculum, and the opportunities of the profession may be had by writing to the Director, the Rev. Lucian L. Lauerma, 2400 Nineteenth St., N. W., Washington, D. C. or from members of the National Council of Catholic Women.

Birth Controllers Termed 'Saboteurs of Family Life'

WASHINGTON.—Birth control advocates, employing the slogan "planned parenthood" and spreading propaganda that would make of us a decadent nation, a selfish and undisciplined people, were termed "saboteurs of family life" in the monthly message sent by Mrs. Robert A. Angelle, President of the National Council of Catholic Women, to diocesan and affiliated groups throughout the country.

-It is our cities, Mrs. Angelle stated, "our American people are replacing themselves by about two-thirds, and our urban professional classes are replacing themselves by only about 50 per cent."
