WASHINGTON — Warsaw, capital of Poland, is being used by the German Nazis as a pattern of death, disease, starvation, economic and political slavery, and wholesale extermination of populations in their plans for world conquest, it is stated in a 24-page pamphlet titled "Tale of a City" issued today by the Office of War Information.

Material for the pamphlet, it was stated, was gathered from many sources, some of them non-

Mission Nuns Write**From 'Most Peaceful
Section of China'**

MATTHENOK, N. Y. — Out of retreat of renewing grace and healing shield, the mission work of two Maryknoll Sisters in China, South China, continues at present time peace, according to a recent situation report from this territory received at the Motherhouse here. They are Sister Mary Leola, of Quincy, Ill., and Sister Mary Albert, of Springfield, Ill.

I think that we are the most peaceful territory in all China," writes one of the sisters. "We see nothing of the war, and hear little about it. We are busy as the day is long, with 60 pupils in daily attendance of our little school, and the boys and girls for Sunday School."

"Catholic organizations have been compelled to close their doors and end their activities."

"Both Lutheran colleges in Warsaw have been converted into military hospitals."

"In a typical church raid, the Nazis swooped down upon the Carmelite chapter in Medowa St., confiscated the property and arrested the nuns. In the villages on the outskirts of Warsaw, priests are held as hostages when peasants fail to meet the grain quota demanded by the Nazis."

"Bread is about the only thing the population can count upon eating. This winter there may be no bread in Warsaw. Forty per cent sawdust, the bread is dark and indigestible. Adults may not receive milk, an adult being anyone older than six months."

The pamphlet reported that all colleges and high schools have been closed and that scientific laboratories have been dismantled and shipped to Germany. The Polish press, it stated, has been suppressed.

With regard to executions, the pamphlet said:
