'Novena of Grace' To Open At St. Patrick's, Mar. 4

The Novena of Grace in honor of St. Francis Xavier, Apostle of the Indies and Japan, will open at St. Patrick's Church, Rochester, on Thursday, March 4, and close on Friday, March 12. Two services will be conducted daily, one at 12:30 (noon) to accommodate office and factory workers in the vicinity, the other at 4 P. M.

An annual event at St. Patrick's, the Novena will be conducted this year by the Rev. Walter J. Burghardt, S.J., currently engaged in the study of ascetical theology at the National Shrine of the North American Martyrs, Auburville.

The Novena of Grace, so called from the remarkable favors of body and soul obtained through the intercession of St. Francis Xavier, was begun by the famed Jesuit missionary himself more than three hundred years ago. In curing a zealous priest at the point of death, the Apostle assured himself that all who would earnestly ask his intercession with God for nine days in honor of his canonization, would infallibly experience the effects of his great power in heaven and would receive whatever they asked, that would contribute to their salvation. Three centuries

of conversions, cures and extraordinary graces have made the Novena tremendously popular throughout the Catholic world.

Topics of the Novena discourses, grouped under the general heading, "There's Something About a Soldier," will be as follows: Thursday, Mar. 4: "Raw Recruit"; Friday, Mar. 5: "Global Strategy"; Saturday, Mar. 6: "Reporting for Duty"; Sunday, Mar. 7: "Service Overseas"; Monday, Mar. 8: "All Home Aboard"; Tuesday, Mar. 9: "Retreat to Victory"; Wednesday, Mar. 10: "Supreme Sacrifice"; Thursday, Mar. 11: "The Purple Heart"; Friday, Mar. 12: "What Price Glory?"

Father Burghardt, a native of New York City, is an alumnus of St. Francis Xavier's and a former instructor at Regis High School in the same city. He has also preached in the archdiocese of New York and Baltimore, and in the dioceses of Syracuse, Albany and Harrisburg.
