

Germans Told Of Fate Of State Scorning God

NEW YORK. — Strenuous the First Commandment, the Vatican Radio in a German language broadcast in Germany asserted that any State which offers a substitute for church, religion and God "is bound to find a calamity and at its appointed hour." It was reported here by the Office of War Information.

"The scorning of God leads to the scorning of man, of those men who have no power themselves," the broadcast stated, adding that whoever scorns the First Commandment is a "grave danger of human personality, of national, political and national life."

"Only when it respects the inalienable rights of the individual as a State must its own demands from the individual," the broadcast continued, "for the State is nothing unbounded. The State is but a servant. It is its task to serve the development of human personality. A return to the supreme law, I am thy God, is prerequisite to a sound social order."

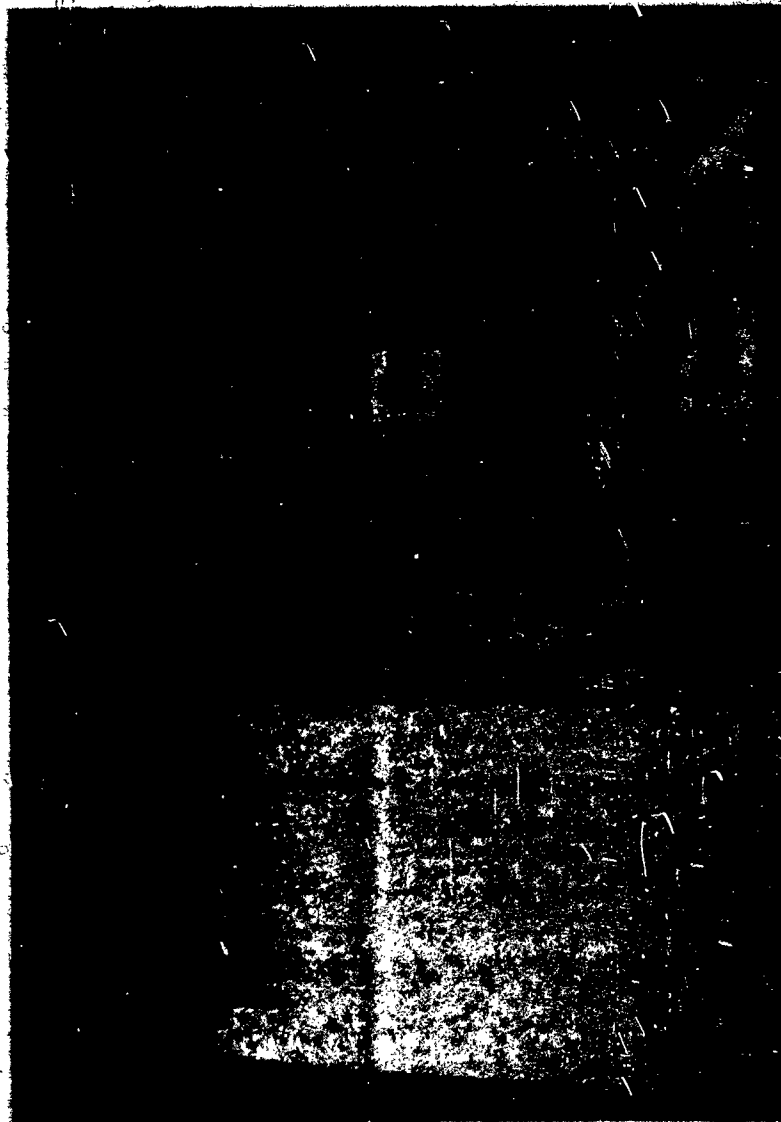

Scrapbook Exhibit To Reveal Schools' Wide Wartime Effort

types of thermometers, on trees, on parachutes, with money bags of all descriptions was listed the enormous sums of stamps and bonds sold and purchased in the schools. In Auburn, Holy Family High, St. Mary's and St. Alphonsus schools are flying a Minute Man flag for excellence in war stamp selling. De Sales high school, Geneva; St. Columba's in Ben Brant, likewise, tell the story of a Minute Man flag.

Keys have been collected by the hundreds of thousands with Blessed Sacrament school boasting of 14,308 in its collection. Colored pictures from St. Ann's, Hornell, show Gay youngsters knitting squares for aghans; while original plays written by six graders were cleverly entered in the book from St. Ambrose. Action close-ups gave the story of St. John the Evangelist's conversion during air raid drills while a miniature movie reel told the story of the school's war activities covering the whole gamut of projects from salvage commands to blood bank canvassers.

Original Activities
St. Andrew's school turned in an enviable report on salvage work; St. Michael's displayed artistic shields bearing stories of work and effort; St. Charles' book had "slick men" building up their bodies for the future. Original songs and skits; acrostics and poems; posters and cartoons; essays and diagrams abound in every book. St. Stanislaus was one of the many schools to dedicate their book to the President of the United States, while any number of youngsters wrote letters to the Chief Executive pledging 100 per cent loyalty to every war project.

Should you be in doubt as to where "our boys over there" in Midway, at the Solomons, in the African desert are getting the courage to fight on in the face of death, they read the youngsters' record of prayers said daily for the men in the armed forces.

Prayer First Featured
Not one of the 77 books turned in failed to record the work done on the prayer front. Heavily, thousands of communications wing their way to the King of Peace petitioning help; daily guards of honor attend Mass and receive Holy Communion; visits are made throughout the day for their "adopted buddy." As one book graphically put it "a little child shall lead them home by prayer."

The schools also turned in representative books—many nature in presentation but nevertheless the story of concentrated effort. These must be seen to be appreciated. Holy Family High, Auburn, depicts well their fine record of stamps and bonds meriting them the Treasury Flag Award and the inclusion of new canvases geared to war time needs.

De Sales High, Geneva, the first school in Ontario County to be the School Minute Man flag, has achieved a remarkable record in the sale of stamps and bonds told in pictures and story. Artistically, students of the Academy of the Sacred Heart have shown their war activities in and after school hours to be varied.

Agnes' stamps and bonds record reveals these leaders in the phase of war activity in the area, and so one will wish to miss their scrapbook report of their model plans activity.

Halesworth Academy shows general student participation in a wide range of activities with an enviable record of achievement in their many undertakings. The report from Our Lady of Mercy High shows similar activity, and one notes with interest the unique recording of various methods and plans used in putting over their war-time program.

Catholic Rochester has something to be proud of. No mother or father should be apathetic to the work the schools have done for the war effort.
