800 Airmen Attend First Afternoon Mass

MONTREAL.—The Most Rev Lawrence Whelan, Auxiliary Bishop of Montreal, officiated at the first afternoon Mass celebrated at the Manning Depot, Lachine, when some 800 airmen were present and several hundred officers and men received Holy Communion.

Bishop Whelan, addressing the airmen in English and French, said that it was the first time in the annals of the Archdiocese of Montreal that Mass had been said in the afternoon. "From time immemorial we have said Mass in the morning, but we cannot forget that the Mass said by Our Lord was said just before the sun was going down."
