Charity Among Nations Must Follow Victory

NEW YORK (AP)—A Government that "departs from charity and justice and seizes from its people total power, by that very fact becomes a threat to the very people and a menace to the unity of nations," the St. Rev. Mgr. Robert F. Keegan, Secretary for Charities to the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York, declared in an address to members of the Archbishop's Commission of the Laity of St. New York Archdiocese.

"That man with a real and lasting peace with justice and charity to all nations" is Christianity and expressed the hope that "may we as a nation have the wisdom from God to win the peace after the war."

"Charity dictates kindness and tolerance in your own lives and in your relationships with your fellowmen," Mgr. Keegan said. "Charity dictates no less in relationships between nations."
