Final Rites Set Today For John P. Keating

Funeral services for John P. Keating, highly esteemed Catholic layman, who was a leader in organizations devoted to spiritual practices, and those of charitable activities, will be held today (Thursday) at the home, 46 Brighton St., and at Blessed Sacrament Church.

Mr. Keating, who was 73 years of age, died at the family residence on Feb. 22, 1943, after a long illness.

Born in Clifton Springs, Mr. Keating came to Rochester as a young man and had been active in Blessed Sacrament parish since 1912.

A member of the Third Order of St. Francis, he had served as President of the Rochester Nocturnal Adoration Society, the Laymen's Retreat League and the Holy Name Society of Blessed Sacrament Church as well as being active in several other lay organizations. His sound advice and leadership were great factors in the development of any worthwhile work he undertook.

A representative of the London Guarantee and Accident Company, Mr. Keating was in business here for 30 years, the first name of the company of recent years being John P. Keating and Son.

He leaves his wife, Mrs. Elizabeth Sommers Keating; his son, Paul Keating, who was his business associate; a daughter, Sister Elizabeth John of the Missionary Servants of the Most Blessed Trinity; two brothers, Thomas and Dennis Keating, Clifton Springs, and three grandchildren.

Burial will be in St. Felix Cemetery, Clifton Springs.
