**Father Stummer Paid
Final Tribute At
Pontifical Rites**

...might come upon him in his study, sitting in the dark, with his feet in his hand, and a tear stealing down his cheek for those for whom he was thinking and praying.

Recalling that gentle, familiar phrase Father Stummer always used after a plea for financial assistance: "Never mind, well do the best we can"—Father Lane said that that was his answer also in his last few days of weakness. "I'm doing the best I can," he summed up his whole life. His moment lay in the chair, which he transformed into beauty at his own expense when he thought that his days were short—the final expression of his love for his parishioners.

"We, his fellow priests," said Father Lane, "pledge our word that we will not forget him. We will continue to pray for the happy repose of his soul."

The body of Father Stummer was laid in state in the church, placed Monday afternoon with a guard of honor of Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, St. John Society, and the Holy Name Society. On Sunday evening priests of the diocese crowded the Office of the Dead. For a last time on Monday morning, priests and laity viewed the body and then filed the pews and standing room to capacity for the service.

DES MOINES, Ia.—As Bishop he will always be "the sturdy adversary of anything un-American as he is the implacable enemy of anything un-Christian," stated the Most Rev. Francis J. L. Beckman, Archbishop of Dubuque at the solemn consecration of the Most Rev. John J. Boylan.

Bishop Boylan, the third Bishop of Rockford, Ill., was formerly President of Dowling College and Vicar General of Des Moines. The ceremony was held in St. Ambrose Cathedral here on Feb. 17. The Most Rev. Gerald T. Bergan, Bishop of Des Moines, was consecrator, assisted by the Most Rev. Henry P. Rohlfman, Bishop of Davenport, and the Most Rev. Edmund Heelan, Bishop of Sioux City.

Have Formula for Peace

Pleading the cause of peace and the rehabilitation of the world that follows victory, Archbishop Beckman said, the Catholic Bishop, together with all those who accept Christ, has his own formula for a post-war world—a world in which neither capital nor labor, neither rugged individualism nor collectivism, shall be predominant, a world in which the middle way, the way of Christ, the just way will be the pattern of men's lives. Christ Himself, the Prince of Peace, dictated that formula, that blue print for a peace with justice, and it is a plan in which all men of good will may unite. It is a plan of action now.

Represent Diocese

Among the more than two score Archbishops, Bishops, and Abbots who attended the ceremony was His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester.

Bishop Boylan studied at St. Bernard's Seminary. His consecration was attended by many priests and missionaries who were members of his class at the Seminary, Monsignor Joseph E. Grady and the Rev. John Smith of Corning, classmates were present.

Bishop Boylan, ordained in 1916, is the fifth member of his class to be raised in the episcopacy. The others are Bishop Walter A. ... of Syracuse, Bishop Matthew Brady of Burlington, V.; Bishop Emmert M. Walsh of Charleston, S. C. and Bishop Francis P. Keough of Providence, R. I.
