FRIDAY NITE DANCE

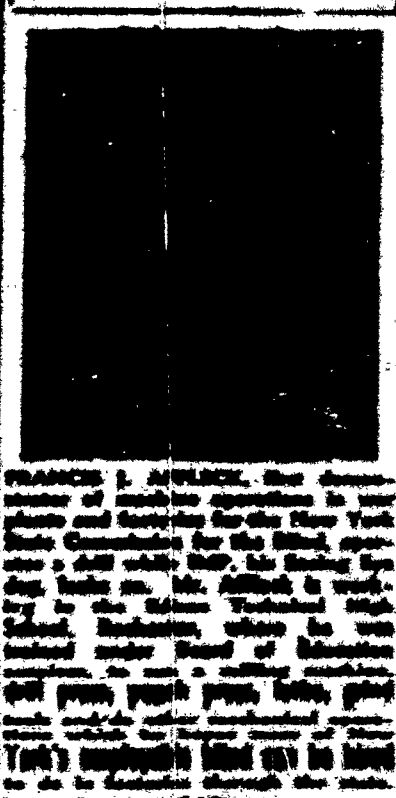
