Victory Plans Rushed When WAACs Take Posts of Men



This Woman's Army Auxiliary Corps member is one of many who have their civilian skills and experiences into the Corps. She is a draftsman, and together with women of many other skills, she will see her ability in service with the Army, allowing another soldier to take his place with the fighting men.

Lieut. Barbara Gwynne announced today in the Federal Building that because of the expansion of the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps by Executive order, additional applications

from women of Rochester are required to fill the ranks of those who are doing their part for victory in the uniform of the WAAC. Women between 21 and 41 years of age, inclusive, who are citizens of the United States, are eligible for enrollment in the WAAC, she said, and can secure full information from her at her office.

"The Army needs the skills and civilian experience of the women of the Nation, as it needs those of the men. Members of the WAAC have an important job to do. Their work releases soldiers for fighting jobs and their contribution is a vital one."

Previous specialized experience is helpful in work with the Army, WAAC.

but is not a requirement for enrollment in the WAAC except in certain categories, she said.

"The WAAC trains its members to do the tasks assigned them, and to do them well. There are all sorts of things to be accomplished by women in uniform. Accountants, bakers, clerks, cashiers, chauffeurs, messengers, draftsmen, librarians, musicians, radio operators, drivers, weather observers, and many others are needed to help the Army do its job—to win the war."

Lieut. Gwynne added, "This is women's war as well as men's, and women are doing their part in the WAAC."

First C. S. C. Group to South America

Three priests of the Congregation of Holy Cross are leaving by plane late in February for Santiago, Chile, where they will assume the administration of the Colegio San Jorge, a high school. The move marks the first educational work of a permanent character undertaken in Latin America by the Congregation, a French religious order founded in 1837. Rev. Wm. C. Hovey, superior of the new group, is former vice-president of St. Edward's University, Austin, Tex. Father Deak is a former member of the faculty of the University of Notre Dame, and Father Schary is a recent member of the faculty of the University of Portland, Portland, Ore. The new work is under the direction of Rev. Thomas A. Gahan, C.S.C., provincial of the United States province of the order.
