

**SCHOOL-AT-WAR 100%**

The youth of St. George's entered wholeheartedly into the War Saving Stamp Campaign. These students have showed their loyalty, love and a spirit of sacrifice for God, Country and their Flag. Indeed they are not expected to fight on the front lines, nevertheless they do their part by buying regularly War Stamps and Bonds at the school canteen.

Their participation has won for them the "School at War" flag, and rates them second to obtain this flag. This flag will fly below the American Flag on the school flag pole.

It is awarded when 90% of the student body has purchased War Stamps. It is given the month after the 90% has been attained and may be down as long as the 90% is retained. Each pupil from the kindergarten up including the Eighth Grade has done his and her share by securing Stamps and Bonds which gives the school a 100%.

Congratulations to our boys and girls for their untiring efforts in helping Uncle Sam to victory, justice and peace!

This spirit of sacrifice shows great signs of citizenship, leadership and heroism. Their aim and ambition is to help their flag flying during the remaining school months, because they realize what our soldiers are going and what inconveniences they are enduring in order to bring peace.
