Disavows 'Revolution' Which Usurps Rights

VATICAN CITY.—If the State should fail to respect all the rights of the individual and of the Church, it forfeits its proper role, and the Church would have to remain outside of the "usurping revolution," reverberating as it has always done the rights of the oppressed.

This assertion is made by L'Union de la Sainte Ligue, a Catholic weekly published at La Haye. In its response to an invitation extended by Marcel Daut, National People's leader, to French Catholics to participate in the national revolution. The paper says French Catholics have the right to know where this revolution will lead them. It points out that French Catholics are good citizens and have the right to have their voice heard.

LENTEM BIBLEAL READINGS SIMPLIFIED TO AID LAY

NEW YORK.—Simplifying one of the inherent difficulties of scriptural reading, the 19 Bible readings from the revised New Testament have been prepared by scripture scholars of the Catholic Biblical Association and follow the chronological order of events in Our Lord's life. The selected passages have been noted for printing in church yearbooks to aid everyone in maintaining the Book of God.

Priest Named Chaplain Of Last Man's Club

NEW ORLEANS.—(NC)—The Rt. Rev. Messrs. John A. Vigners, Chancellor of the Diocese of Lafayette, has been named chaplain for the Last Man's Club of the 641 Commandant 1st Air Army and Washington Artillery at the annual meeting of the group. The meeting is held annually on Washington's Birthday to commemorate the landing of Washington Artillery in 1807.

Matrimonial Clinic Established To Combat Divorce, Other Evils

WICHITA.—(NC)—As a means of assisting persons confronted with matrimonial difficulties, the Diocesan Matrimonial Clinic has been established here and given formal recognition and Episcopal approval by the Most Rev. Christian H. Wislizenus, Bishop of Wichita. Headquarters of the Clinic, which meets each Thursday evening have been established at St. Francis Hospital. In a statement outlining the nature and purpose of the clinic, it was declared the clinic was founded "because of the changing social conditions, the relaxation of the moral code and the increasing numbers of divorces and separations arising primarily from the effects of the war effort." Dozens of members of the clinic were outlined as "to aid in giving counsel, advice and assistance to couples anticipating marriage and to discuss, when necessary, couples desiring to renew their marriage and unceremonious marriages" as well as to assist married couples who have encountered difficulties which threaten to break up their married life.
