

List Fordham Professor For Culture Lecture, March 21

Dr. Pegis, Coworker With Gilson, To Be Heard At Chamber

Dr. Anton C. Pegis, professor of philosophy in the graduate school of Fordham University will deliver the eighth lecture in the Christian Culture Series at the Chamber of Commerce, Monday, Mar 21, at 8 P. M.

Graduate of the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies, Dr. Pegis is the author of several learned works in the field of history of philosophy. Coworker with the great French Navist, Etienne Gilson, Pegis has continued Gilson's work here in America.

At present Gilson is in Nazi-occupied Paris with little chance to extend his influence. Pegis is a convert to Catholicism from the Greek-Catholic Church.

His lecture here in the Aquinas series marks his first appearance in Rochester. An open forum following Pegis' lecture here has been announced by the founder of the series, the Rev. Hugh Hailey, C.S.B.

The remaining lecture in the series this season brings from Werfel, author of the "Song of Bernadette" on April 11.
