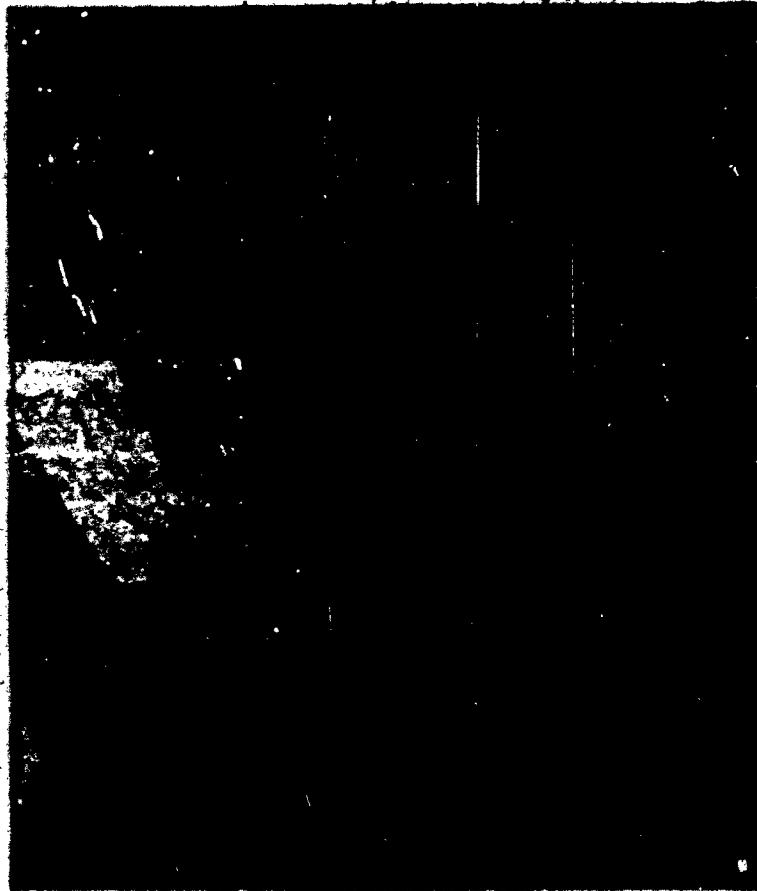


ONCE PRISONERS, NOW CHAPLAINS

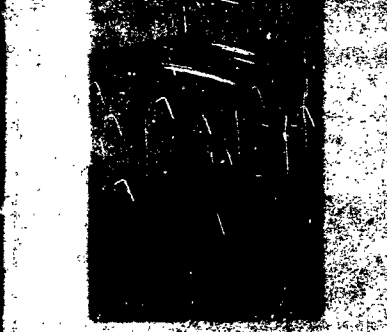

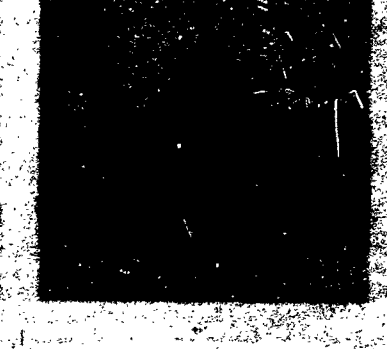
