The return was made following Benediction in the afternoon.

Catholic Navy Man Is Awarded Silver Star

LISLE, Ill. (NC)—The Silver Star Medal has been awarded to Lieut. Al J. Havlik, an alumnus of St. Procopius College, here, for bravery in the performance of duty during battle. He is the medical officer aboard a destroyer. Aboard the cruiser, which survived the crash of a Japanese torpedo plane, causing an explosion and fire on the ship's fore deck, Lieut. Havlik was forced to abandon his regular station and assume a gunnery station.

Following the installation, luncheon was served and suitable testimonials were presented to the outgoing officers: Prefect, Mrs. Caroline Schied; Secretary, Mrs. Caroline Baker; and Treasurer, Mrs. Louise Schoen.
