MARINES, SAILORS ON WAR POST SEND DONATION TO CHAPLAINS' AND ASSOCIATION

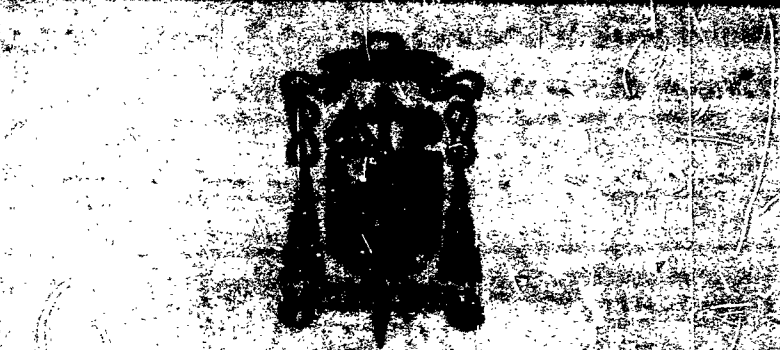
