Assists Fr. Singerhoff At Outdoor Masses In Africa

GENEVA—The family of Soldier John Francis Gilbert of Geneva, who is Chaplain's Aide for Chaplain David E. Singerhoff somewhere in North Africa have received a letter describing the difficulties under which Father Singerhoff has to celebrate Mass in that area of the war.

Disavows 'Revolution' Which Usurps Rights

VATICAN CITY—If the State should fail to respect all the rights of the individual and of the Church, it forfeits its proper role, and the Church would have to remain outside of the "usurping revolution" re-inventing as it has always done the rights of the oppressed.

This assertion is made by L'Espresso in Rome Letter, a Catholic weekly published at Le Fay in its response to an invitation extended by Marcel Deat, National Popular leader, to Frenchmen to "participate in the national revolution." The paper says French Catholics have the right to know where this revolution will lead them. It points out that French Catholics are good citizens and have the right to have their voice heard.

WICHITA (NC)—As a means of assisting persons confronted with matrimonial difficulties, the Diocesan Matrimonial Clinic has been established here and given formal recognition and Episcopal approval by the Most Rev. Christian H. Wichelmann, Bishop of Wichita.
 Headquarters of the Clinic, which meets each Thursday evening have been established at St. Francis Hospital.
 In a statement outlining the nature and purpose of the clinic, it was stated the clinic was

founded "because of the changing social conditions, the relaxation of the moral code and the increasing numbers of divorces and separations arising primarily from the effects of the war effort."
 Duties of members of the clinic were outlined as "to aid in giving counsel, advice and instructions to couples anticipating marriage and to discuss, when necessary, couples desiring to rush into hasty and unpremeditated marriage" as well as to assist married couples who have encountered difficulties which threaten to break up their married life.
