Assists Fr. Singerhoff At Outdoor Masses In Africa

CRETEVA—The family of Father John Francis Gilbert of Geneva, wife is Charlotte's Altar for Chaplain David B. Singerhoff somewhere in North Africa have received a letter describing the difficulties under which Father Singerhoff has to celebrate Mass in that area of the war.

An excerpt from the letter states:

"There has been very little Father could do for us as we have no vehicle at present and it is difficult to get around. Here though we have a very nice Chapel for morning Mass and there are two other priests. It is not unusual for me to go to two Masses, including ours. That would be a heavy burden.

Recently I received

"Last Sunday we had Mass and we made supply boxes, second in a wine cellar, and third in heavy ammunition boxes at 9:30 P.M. or so. I wouldn't like but rather the beauty of the reparation. The altar was between two small trees like sweeping willows with beautiful yellow leaves, behind the altar were rows of the same type of tree or bush, and the setting in the distant mountains.

"The light coming down through the trees and ruined Mass was beautiful, making one forget the mud covered houses, the mud roads, and the slight shower from a passing cloud which had not enhanced our altar.

"Sometimes, after mass communion with altar kept immaculate, I would almost question the way we have to sometimes operate, but then something like this with the men kneeling on the damp ground makes it very real and necessary and you feel as if the Lord can't possibly see His fallen sheep or perhaps the All-holy Being stands at the hand-reared bed bottom of Father's pulpit.

"This is no doubt something we will all be glad to leave, but I can't help thinking sometimes that we will miss those daily happenings and have a good many vivid pictures for the remainder of our lives, which I am firmly convinced will give us a greater appreciation in peace, of the body and the soul.

"Sometimes, although I would be glad to be home with all of you, I think we are both benefiting by it. You never had as many prayers stated up the day nor did I. It is like taking a job out of town for awhile with a bigger salary, that I might return home with savings for a start.

Women Collect Funds For Seminary

Buenos Aires—A special collection has been started by women of La Plata for the construction of a minor seminary. The building which is to be dedicated to Our Lady of Lujan, will accommodate some 200 students.

Matrimonial Clinic Established To Combat Divorce, Other Evils

WICHITA (Mo.)—As a means of assisting persons confronted with matrimonial difficulties, the Diocesan Matrimonial Clinic has been established here and given formal recognition and Episcopal approval by the Most Rev. Christian H. Wickham, Bishop of Wichita.

Headquarters of the Clinic, which meets each Thursday evening have been established at St. Francis Hospital.

In a statement outlining the nature and purpose of the clinic, it was disclosed the clinic was

founded "because of the changing social conditions, the relaxation of the moral code and the increasing numbers of divorces and separations arising primarily from the effects of the war effort."

Duties of members of the clinic were outlined as "to aid in giving counsel, advice and instructions to couples anticipating marriage and to divorce, when necessary, couples desiring to make their family and unremarried marriages" as well as to assist married couples who have encountered difficulties which threaten to break up their married life.
