The soldiers assisted at a Mass which was said at the Shrine by their chaplain, Captain the Rev. St. Georges Bergstrom, two of the uniformed men acting as servers. The return was made following Benediction in the afternoon.

Lauretta, Pa.—The Rev. Clement White, the fourth member of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis in Lauretta to enter the armed forces, has been commissioned a Lieutenant and will report at the chaplain training school at Harvard University.

### Catholic Navy Man Is Awarded Silver Star

LISLE, Ill.—(NC)—The Silver Star Medal has been awarded to Lieut. Al J. Havlik, an alumnus of St. Procopius' College, here, for bravery in the performance of duty during battle. He is the medical officer aboard a destroyer.

Aboard the destroyer, which survived the crash of a Japanese torpedo plane, causing an explosion and fire on the ship's fore deck, Lieut. Havlik was forced to abandon his regular station and assume a gunnery station.
