With His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, presiding at the final absolution, funeral services for Miss Nellie O'Hern, sister of the late Bishop John Francis O'Hern were conducted at Corpus Christi Church, Tuesday, Mar. 19.

Miss O'Hern, 19, died at her home, 440 Alexander St., on Mar. 15, 1943, following a brief illness. Her brother, the Rev. Thomas J. O'Hern, pastor of St. Bartholomew's Church, Buffalo, offered the Solemn Requiem Mass 1978 in Epiphany. Assisting were: Deacon, the Rev. William A. O'Hern, Dubois, Pa., and Subdeacon, the Rev. at the lighter celebrations emphasized the world situation this year. At the pastoral church, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney celebrated Solemn Pontifical Mass at 10 A. M. Wednesday morning and the panegyric was ably delivered by the Rev. Dr. Maynard Coughlin of St. Bernard's Seminary. Friends of the diocese joined in the religious ceremony conducted in the newly decorated sanctuary of St. Patrick's Church.

Members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians assembled at Hotel Seneca for their traditional observance and flag, reels, hornpipes and the dances of the horreiland were enjoyed by men in uniform, guests of the A. O. H. Part of the proceeds went to the USO.

With His Excellency, Bishop Kearney as guest of honor the Eighth Annual St. Patrick's banquet of the Knights of Equity drew a capacity crowd to Powers Hotel.

Dedicated to Irish motherhood, the program this year was well balanced and brought tears and laughter from the large number of diners.

Characteristic of the Irish race and demonstrated through the centuries is the devotion to Mother Church, Mother Country and the Mothers That Bore Them. His Excellency said as he pointed out the great contribution made by Irishmen and women to preservation of liberty and the sanctity of the home.

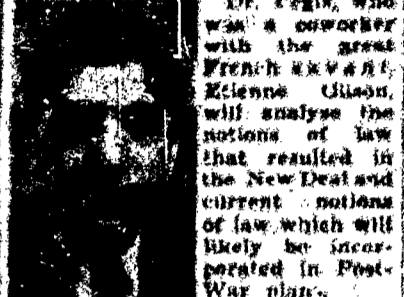
From St. Patrick, Irish mothers learned the lessons which they handed down to their sons and daughters and it is to keep intact those principles for which Irish descendants are fighting today.

BIRMINGHAM — (NC) — Setting an example for the faithful of his Diocese, the Most Rev. Thomas J. Toolen, Bishop of Mobile, donated a pint of his blood to the plasma bank of St. Vincent's Hospital here.

Stressing the inestimable value of plasma in the treatment of shock and burn cases, Bishop Toolen urged citizens to aid the blood banks of their local hospitals. He emphasized the need for plasma is great during normal times in the event of civilian epidemics and disasters, but stressed the fact that the need is far greater in time of war.
