3 Hours Observance
Good Friday Set By
Church, Civic Groups

WASHINGPORT, IND.—Plans to promote the widespread religious observance of Good Friday have been announced by the Committee for the Three Hours' Observance of Good Friday in North America's Capital.

This movement, supported by religious, fraternal, civic, business and service organizations and prominent individuals of many denominations, was inaugurated here three years ago to bring about city-wide observance of the Three Hours. The purpose is to secure the voluntary cooperation of Washington business firms in granting their employees from noon to 3 P. M. on Good Friday a period for prayer and worship in commemoration of Our Lord's sacrifice on the Cross.

Nearly 30 civic groups are among the organizations which have offered their services in promoting the observance. In addition, such varied groups as the American Legion, Salvation Army, American Federation of Labor, Congress of Industrial Organizations, Catholic Daughters of America, Daughters of Justice, Catholic Evidence Guild, International Federation of Catholic Alumnae, Holy Name Union, Knights of Columbus, Police and Firemen's Benevolent, Y. M. C. A., I. W. C. A., Merchants and Manufacturers Association and Washington Federation of Churches, have joined the movement.

Monument Appeals.
The movement for religious observance of the Three Hours on Good Friday was started 33 years ago in San Francisco and has grown widely in every section of the country. Thirteen states now observe Good Friday as a legal holiday.

The manner of observance varies with the locality. One devotion is the Stations of the Cross in the open-air. Large crowds attend these services in this city and in Indianapolis, Indianapolis, New York City and Pittsburg, Pa. These services are conducted by the Catholic Evidence Guild. A pantomime play was enacted in Winona, Kansas, while in California business houses, theaters and municipal offices are closed while the people attend Church services. In some places where the theaters remain open a religious service is presented rather than the usual program.

The publication by the press of news articles, editorials and cartoons in favoring widespread radio broadcasting companies use the events of the first Holy Week as the motif for programs during the days preceding Good Friday.

MOUNT KISCO, N. Y.—A Spiritual Banquet of Masses and Holy Communions for the Iniation of His Holiness Pope Pius XII is being prepared by members of the Junior Catholic Daughters of America as a chief part of the observance of the seventeenth anniversary of the founding of the organization, and will be transmitted to the Holy Father for Easter. It has been announced here by Beatrice M. Hoffmann, National Junior Director.

The anniversary celebrations started on Washington's Birthday and continuing on a nation-wide scale, includes Communion Breakfasts, patriotic programs and Junior Court functions, as well as initiations and general meetings.



Lauds Labor Board Choice

Honored by Pope

Carroll, Auxiliary of Pittsburgh, and since 1940 attached to the office of the Papal Secretariat of State in Vatican City, has been named a Privy Chamberlain to His Holiness Pope Pius XII with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor. (Courtesy of the newly named Privy Chamberlain, Msgr. William J. Carroll and the late William J. Carroll of Pittsburgh, were both formerly from Rochester. Monsignor Carroll has an uncle, Thomas E. Carroll in Rochester and another uncle, Michael J. Carroll of Syracuse.)

Monsignor Carroll, a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, was called to the Vatican in September, 1930. He became the third American priest to fill the office to which he was called. His predecessors were the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, now Archbishop of New York, and the Most Rev. Joseph P. Hurley, now Bishop of St. Augustine. Last April, Monsignor Carroll was honored with appointment to the Supreme Council of the Missionary Union of the Clergy.

Born in Pittsburgh June 16, 1892, Monsignor Carroll attended Holy Rosary grammar and high schools and Duquesne University in that city. He studied philosophy at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland, from which he received the degree Doctor of Philosophy. In 1920, he attended the North American College in Rome and took theology in the Pontifical Gregorian University, which granted him the Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 1926. He had just returned to parochial duties in his home Diocese of Pittsburgh after 10 years abroad, when he was named to the papal post in the Papal Secretariat of State.

Monsignor Carroll is one of a family of three children, all of whom entered the priesthood. His brothers are the Very Rev. Msgr. Howard J. Carroll, Assistant General Secretary of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, Washington, D. C. and the Rev. Coleman P. Carroll, priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh presently at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.
