3 Hours Observance Good Friday Set By Church, Civic Groups

WASHINGTON, (AP) — Plans to promote the widespread observance of Good Friday have been announced by the Committee for the Three Hours' Observance of Good Friday in the Nation's Capital.

This observance, supported by religious, fraternal, civic, business and service organizations and prominent individuals of many denominations, was inaugurated last year. The purpose is to devote the voluntary cooperation of Washington business firms to granting their employees from noon to 3 P. M. on Good Friday a period for prayer and worship in commemoration of Our Lord's sacrifice on the Cross.

Nearly 50 civic groups are among the organizations which have offered their services in promoting the observance. In addition, such varied groups as the American Legion, Salvation Army, American Federation of Labor, Congress of Industrial Organizations, Catholic Daughters of America, Daughters of Isabella, Catholic Evidence Guild, International Federation of Catholic Alumni, Holy Name Union, Knights of Columbus, Police and Firemen's Society, Y. M. C. A., Y. W. C. A., Merchants and Manufacturers' Association and Washington Federation of Churches, have joined the movement.

The observance for religious observance of the Three Hours on Good Friday was started 33 years ago in San Francisco and has grown widely in every section of the country. Thirteen states now observe Good Friday as a legal holiday.

The manner of observance varies with the locality. One devotion is the Stations of the Cross in the open-air. Large crowds attend these services in the city and in Birmingham, Indianapolis, New York City and Pittsburg, Pa. These services are conducted by the Catholic Evidence Guild. A parish play was staged in Winchester, Kansas, while in California business houses, theaters and municipal offices are closed while the people attend Church services. In some places where the theaters remain open a religious service is presented rather than the usual program.

The publication by the press of news articles, editorials and sermons is becoming widespread. Radio broadcasting companies use the events of the Holy Week as the motif for programs during the days preceding Good Friday.

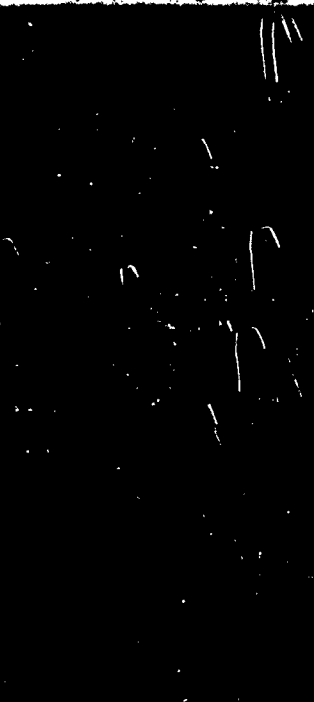
Junior Catholic Daughters Prepare Easter Spiritual Banquet For Pope Pius XII

MOUNT KISCO, N. Y. — A Spiritual Banquet of Masses and Holy Communion for the intention of His Holiness Pope Pius XII is being prepared by members of the Junior Catholic Daughters of America as a chief part of the observance of the seventeenth anniversary of the founding of the organization, and will be transmitted to the Holy Father for Easter. It has been announced here by Beatrice M. Hoffman, National Junior Director.

The anniversary celebrations started on Washington's Birthday and, continuing on a nation-wide scale, includes Communion Breakfasts, patriotic programs and Junior Court functions, as well as initiations and general meetings.

Honored by Pope

American Priest At Vatican Named Private Chamberlain

VATICAN CITY, (AP) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has named the Rev. Dr. Walter E. Carroll, an American priest attached to the Papal Secretariat of State, a Private Chamberlain with the title of Very Reverend Monsignor.

Parents of the newly named Private Chamberlain, Mrs. William J. Carroll and the late William J. Carroll of Pittsburgh, were both formerly from Rochester. Monsignor Carroll has as sons, Thomas E. Carroll in Rochester, and another son, Michael J. Carroll of Syracuse.

Monsignor Carroll, a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, was called to the Vatican in September, 1940. He became the third American priest to fill the office to which he was called. His predecessors were the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, now Archbishop of New York, and the Most Rev. Joseph P. Hurley, now Bishop of St. Augustine. Last April Monsignor Carroll was honored with appointment to the Supreme Council of the Missionary Union of the Clergy.

Born in Pittsburgh, June 14, 1904, Monsignor Carroll attended Holy Rosary grammar and high schools and Duquesne University in that city. He studied philosophy at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland, from which he received the degree Doctor of Philosophy in 1932. He attended the North American College in Rome and took theology in the Pontifical Gregorian University, which granted him the Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 1936. He had just returned to parochial duties in his home Diocese of Pittsburgh, after 10 years abroad, when he was named to the prominent post in the Papal Secretariat of State.

Monsignor Carroll is one of a family of three children, all of whom entered the priesthood. His brothers are the Very Rev. Mgr. Howard J. Carroll, Assistant General Secretary of the National Catholic Welfare Conference, Washington, D. C., and the Rev. Coleman F. Carroll, a priest of the Diocese of Pittsburgh presently at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

Lauds Labor Board Choice

WINDSOR, Ont. — "Dow finds it hard to fathom the psychology back of the protest which the Grand Orange Lodge has made respecting the make-up of the new National War Labor Board. It has no fault to find with the qualifications or ability of any of the three members. Its one complaint is that not one of them is a Protestant. Two are Roman Catholics and one is a Jew," says The Windsor Star, local daily popular newspaper in an editorial.

(Justice McEwen, chairman of the National War Labor Board,

and Senator Joseph Benck, representative of employers, are the Catholics referred to as the Board and J. L. Cohen, K.C., Toronto, representative of employers is the Jewish member.)

The Star editorial adds: "The most unprovoked condemnation will be forgiven for wondering what the religious beliefs of these men have to do with the case. They are presumably chosen for their ability to carry out the duties entrusted to them, and few have ventured to say that they do not measure up to this requirement."
