

Third Order Of St. Francis

The reception of new members will take place at the next meeting of the Third Order of St. Francis on Sunday afternoon, Mar. 22, at 2:30 P. M. The place of meeting is St. Patrick's Church on Plymouth Avenue North.

New members should bring with them the card bearing name and address, adding the name of their parish and the name by which they wish to be known in religion. They should send themselves in the front pews and retain their cards until taken from them by the Master or Mistress of Novices.

At the April meeting there will be a Profession of all those who have completed a year's novitiate. All who are interested in the Third Order are invited to be present at either ceremony. Members of the Nocturnal Adoration Society would find themselves at home within the Franciscan fold. It is a haven, not for those who at one time heard the call of a vocation but were unable to follow it. In the Third Order they will find a religious habit, a Rule, an Office, and a niche in religion just like those of the Second and First Orders which comprise the Name and Filial of St. Francis. Many seculars and secular priests find the Third Order a source of many graces. Our Holy Father, Pius XII is a Tertiary.

The Rule of the Third Order requires that Tertiaries make prudent arrangements concerning their worldly affairs, including the making of a will. Since they have the privilege of being buried in the full Franciscan habit, it is wise to have the habit made and relatives instructed with regard to it.

Relatives should also be instructed to include in newspaper notices the fact that the deceased is a Tertiary and to notify the Spiritual Advisor of the Order at St. Patrick's Rectory in order that the rosary may be said, according to custom, at 6 o'clock on the day preceding the funeral.

During Lent, when spiritual reading is especially important, Tertiaries as well as other Catholics are urged to make use of the really good selection of Catholic books at the Rochester Public Library. Ask to be directed to the shelves where books on religion are kept. If there is a demand for Catholic books, more will be added.

PIPLS AND RED CROSS

Participation is shifting into high gear at St. John the Evangelist School, Humboldt St., as the pupils rush to complete a special Red Cross project. Letters requested by Mrs. Henry W. Hays, who directs Junior Red Cross activities. The folders are being raised designs for Easter Greeting cards in French to be sent to the blind.

From the first to the eighth grade the children at St. John's participate in Red Cross work. Over 1,000 letters have just been packed and sent to headquarters constituting a special order from Mrs. Hays. This order consisted in 200 decorated toy cloth, 200 decorated napkins, 200 place cards and 200 designed menu pads.

First and second graders have made over 20 Christmas books for the children and refugees. Doll sets, games and scrap books totaling 200 have been completed for short-line and injured soldiers. The training units comprised of both boys and girls have completed 570 Afghan square button making one small night's completion.

Class room rivalry spurs the 11 Junior Red Cross Units organized in the school as its associated work. With 100% enrollment participation is keen as workers watch for the coveted banner to be hung on their door for leading the school in this week's race for complete articles.
