## Students Strike When Rector In Mexico Is Ousted By Politicians

MEXICO CITY (NC)—Ousting by Michoacan politicians of Dr. Vicentino Anguiano from his position as Rector of the University of San Nicolas de Hidalgo at Morelia, presumably because he advocated amendment of Article 3 of the Federal Constitution at the recent National Education Congress, has had further repercussions in the Capital. The student body of the National Autonomous University here is on strike and refuses to return to classes until full autonomy is restored to the Morelia institution.

President Manuel Avila Camacho has withdrawn Federal aid from San Nicolas.

The direct action of the President, which confirms his announced policy that the social and cultural forces of the country are not to be subjected to political capriciousness and the arbitrariness of government officials, has met with popular acclaim and is regarded as a masterpiece politically.

It has always been a matter of great satisfaction to the majority of Mexicans that the universities, because of their constitutionally guaranteed autonomy, have been able to keep higher education in Mexico free from the influence of "Socialist" or other political trends.

Popular sympathy naturally would be on the side of the Rector of the Autonomous University of San Nicolas which happens to be one of the oldest in America, having been founded by the first Bishop of Michoacan, who had proposed amendment of the obnoxious education clause in the Federal Constitution.
