HOLY NAME SPEAKERS

The development of nervous and mental disorders during periods of stress was noted by Mr. J. Gerald Laughlin, principal speaker at the monthly meeting of the Holy Name Society. He showed how Catholic institutions such as the Sacraments, prayer and a Catholic philosophy could help Catholic children maintain mental health.

Speaker at the meeting was Mr. Laughlin's wife. She is outlining the work of the Holy Name Society. Mr. Laughlin said "Every boy really wants to make good—to be of value to his." Speaking from his own experience, he urged them to use their own knowledge. It gives them to most community organizations. It points the way to good citizenship through service. A practical example was the unselfish cooperation of our boys in the war effort—collection of the past year.

Proud of Army Sons
