### Schools Scrapbook Honored

**HORNELL**—St. Ann's School received certificates of honor for its Schools at War scrapbook at a rally at the Eastman Theater in Rochester on Saturday evening, March 16. The scrapbook, entered by pupils of the first eight grades of St. Ann's, was judged in competition with entries from 77 schools throughout the Rochester Diocese, being one of few to attain this honor.

Pupils in every grade of the elementary school contributed towards the success of the scrapbook by submitting articles, poems, and various drawings illustrating the work the school has done in the line of knitting for the Red Cross, collecting soap and magazines and the like. Pupils also illustrated the success of the Rosary bead collection, sent to men in the armed services.

Jeanne Burke, a pupil in the eighth grade of St. Ann's school, was chosen as the student representative to receive the award for the school. Jeanne, who is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John G. Burke of 13 Mill Street, Hornell, composed a summary of the school's activities for the war effort. Her composition was included in the scrapbook.

Students of St. Ann's School are continuing with their Red Cross activities and their war projects. At present the sale of defense stamps among the pupils exceeds \$12,000.

### Lenten Sermon

The Rev. John P. O'Malley, assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church, was the speaker at the Sunday evening Lenten service on March 16. Father O'Malley's talk was based on the subject "What

Does It Profit a Man to Gain the Whole World if He Suffers the Loss of His Own Soul?" He contrasted the cost of the body, financially valued at under two dollars, with the cost of the immortal soul. The soul, he pointed out, is so dear to Christ that He gave each drop of His blood to redeem it.

Father O'Malley cited numerous cases in the history of the Church as examples of the various evaluations men have placed on his soul. The recitation of the Rosary preceded Father O'Malley's talk. The services were closed with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

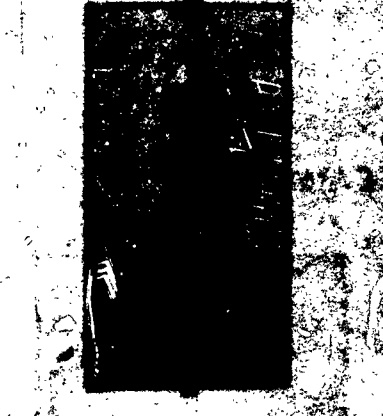

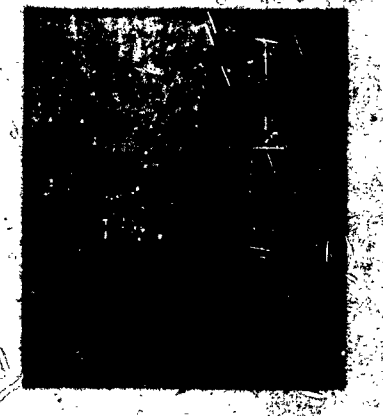
