Students Strike When Rector In Mexico Is Ousted By Politicians

MEXICO CITY (NC)—Ousting by Michoacan politicians of Dr. Victoriano Anguiano from his position as Rector of the University of San Nicolas de Hidalgo at Morelia, presumably because he advocated amendment of Article 2 of the Federal Constitution of the recent National Education Congress, has had further repercussions in the Capital. The student body of the National Autonomous University here is on strike and refuses to return to classes until full autonomy is restored to the Michoacan University.

President Manuel Avila Camacho has withdrawn Federal aid from the Michoacan University. The direct action of the President, which condemns his educational policy that the social and cultural fabric of the country are not to be subjected to political capriciousness and the arbitrariness of government officials, has met with popular acclaim and is regarded as a masterpiece politically.

It has always been a matter of great satisfaction to the majority of Mexicans that the university, because of their constitutionally guaranteed autonomy, have been able to keep higher education in Mexico free from the influence of "Reactionist" or other political trends.

685,288 HOLY COMMUNIONS RECEIVED BY SERVICEMEN IN MONTH OF DECEMBER

NEW YORK.—Reports from 1,126 commissioned and 102 auxiliary chaplains on duty with the armed forces reveal that a total of 685,288 Holy Communion were received by American fighting men all over the world during December, it was announced at the Military Ordinariate today.

The figures represent a new monthly high official record. It does not include Holy Communion received by Catholic military personnel at civilian churches. In discussing the figures, the Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.A., Military Delegate, said that the highest previous number of Holy Communion reported was for the month of November, 1942, when reports from 1,686 commissioned and 127 auxiliary chaplains showed a total of 684,516 Sacred Hosts distributed to military personnel.

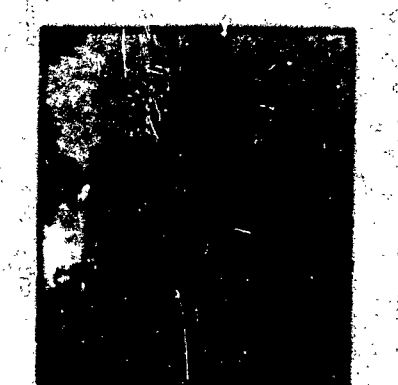
