

'International Law' Study Features Verein Session

The resolution entitled International Law which was adopted at the 1942 National Convention of the Catholic Central Verein at St. Louis last August was the subject of discussion at the regular monthly meeting of the Rochester Branch last Sunday afternoon.

The resolution was read and commented upon by former County Judge Philip H. Donnelly. August Hader, Anthony Keurig, Martin Spindler, Oliver Wadsworth, August Maler, Laura Schilling and Rev. Stephen W. Aulbach, C.S.P., spiritual adviser of the Branch.

It was pointed out that international law, so-called, has in the past been ineffective, because of the lack of a proper sanction. Nations appeared to have entered into agreements with reservations and no hesitancy was shown in their taking advantage of the reservation when it was to their interest. If there is to be a lasting and enduring peace, it was shown by the speakers there must be a sanction which will be effective, and that sanction, it was stated, is the moral law based upon the natural law.

Cleric Pope's Message

The souls for a just and enduring peace, it was contended, is contained in the four Christmas messages of Pope Pius XII, and the members were urged to read those messages and become acquainted with the principles contained in them.

There can be no lasting peace unless the common good of all nations and the peoples of all nations is taken into consideration in formulating the peace terms. Present indications are that more attention will be given to that phase of the peace terms than has at any time been done in the past.

According to the principles laid down in the Christmas messages of Pope Pius XII, the basis of the law of nations or international law must consider and respect the rights of all peoples.

In other words those formulating the law must recognize the existence of a law outside of man, and the need for the mutual acceptance of rights and duties.

Moreover, it was pointed out, any code of international law must in the first instance take notice of the fact that the human race is one and that each and every nation must be concerned with the well being of each and every other nation.

Sunday, May 17, was fixed as the date for the annual celebration by the Branches of the Catholic Central Verein and National Catholic Women's Union of the anniversary of the Labor Encyclicals of Pope Leo XIII and Pope Pius XI.

Cornelius Schmitt reported that the social hour held in connection

with the February meeting of the Branch was the most satisfactory in years.

Vice-President William Whitman presided at the meeting. He welcomed the committee which had been appointed by President William J. Finamore.
