OWEGO - Students of St. Patrick's Parochial School, together with the other schools of the Rochester Diocese, enjoyed Monday as a holiday. This was granted by the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of the Diocese, in recognition of the splendid work accomplished by the pupils of the parochial schools in the recent Scrap Drive and other War effort work. In the drive for the collection of scrap late last Fall the students of St. Patrick's stood second in the amount collected, going ahead of the students of the Owego Free Academy which includes the Junior High and the Senior High

School. They have also been exceedingly active in all other war activities.

CORNING - Patrick J. Canny, 74, died at the Corning Hospital Wednesday, Mar. 17. Mr. Canny, who was born in Ennis, County Clare, Ireland, the son of James and Mary McInerney Canny. He came to America as a young man and began to work for the Erie Railroad only a few days after his arrival. From 1905 until his retirement in 1930 he was employed as a fireman with the railroad. On Jan. 24, 1936, he married Mary Sullivan in a ceremony performed at St. Mary's Church. Mrs. Canny died a few years ago.

Survivors are: Two sons, James P. Canny, Erie Railroad assistant general attorney of Cleveland, O., and Joseph Canny of Corning, one daughter, Miss Catherine Canny of Corning.

Funeral services were held from the Poland Funeral Home at 10 a. m. Saturday and at 10:30 o'clock at St. Mary's Church. The requiem mass was celebrated by the Rev. John A. Smith, pastor. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery.

'MY CHANGELESS FRIEND' BOOKLETS AGAIN EXTENDED

NEW YORK - The Apostleship of Prayer has published a new booklet in the series "My Changeless Friend" by the Rev. Francis P. LeBuffe, S.J., Regional Secretary of the Sodality of Our Lady. It is the twenty-seventh in the series.

As in previous publications, the latest booklet reveals in the central theme of the meditations that its subject matter is chosen to soft the troubles of the time. In his preface, Father LeBuffe writes: "It would be difficult to recall any period in the world's history when men had more sorrow and pain, fear and anxiety, than they have today."

Each meditation begins with an evocative illustration of the writer's point. In the booklet are chapters with such titles as "God's Queer Ways," "Blurt It Out to Our Lord" and "Small Men Strut in Uniform."

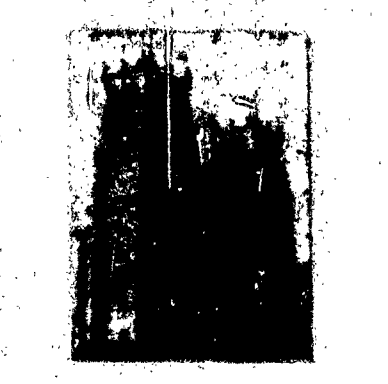
