'Living Rosary' Ceremony Marks Sodality Observance

Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral was the scene on March 25 of a beautiful and colorful ceremony in honor of the feast of the Annunciation with the Sodality Union as sponsor and Sacred Heart Sodality as host.

With the Pyrosian Choir of Nazareth Academy lending a musical background, a procession in the form of a "Living Rosary" was made up of 28 sodalists from 28 parishes. The girls, each representing a "Hail Mary," wore long dresses of pastel shades and carried blue and white lights while the boys represented the "Our Fathers" and carried red and white lights.

Rev. Roy Murphy, director of the Union, led the recitation of the rosary and as each "Hail Mary" was said, the person representing that particular prayer went to the altar and gave the light to be placed at the foot of a statue of the Blessed Mother.

"Hail Mary" and how seldom it was said with concentration and how often it is merely "skipped over." He asked that each make a resolution that every "Hail Mary" said from that time until the next feast of the Annunciation, be said with true thought behind it. At the close of the Bishop's talk, the church was blessed except for the candles on the altar. While an Ave Maria was played, the congregation silently meditated on the "Hail Mary."

Previous to Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Bishop and priests at the altar sang the Preface from the Mass of the Feast of the Annunciation. In the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Mgr.
