Answer To Her Prayer, Nine Priests Attend As Air Raid Victim Dies

LONDON.—When the priests went in expectation to Miss Mary Richardson's death, visitors on an air raid bomb in a church where they did not realize that they had found a possible answer to her often-repeated fervent prayer.

Mrs. Richardson was 28 years old. Circumstances compelled her to live in a village which had no church nearer than several miles away. It did not seem likely, if death should strike suddenly, that there would be a priest at hand to attend her.

It so happened that a group of army chaplains wished to hold a meeting and found upon the village

at the place. They were walking through the village when when an enemy airplane dropped its bombs. They saw Mrs. Richardson run out to her side, one of the priests assisted her to the shade back in prayer.
