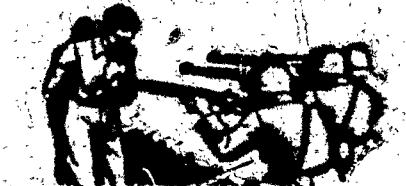
ASK DAN ON NIGHT WORK FOR WOMEN IN FACTORIES
