

Prelate Cites Guide To Industrial Justice

WHEELING, W. Va., (AP)—An informed and effective Christian conscience is the only power which can bring capital and labor to a realization of their respective mutual rights. The Most Rev. John J. Surin, Bishop of Wheeling, said in an address which closed a five-

day meeting of the Catholic Congress on Industrial Problems here. Bishop Surin's address outlined the program of the Congress on social reconstruction. 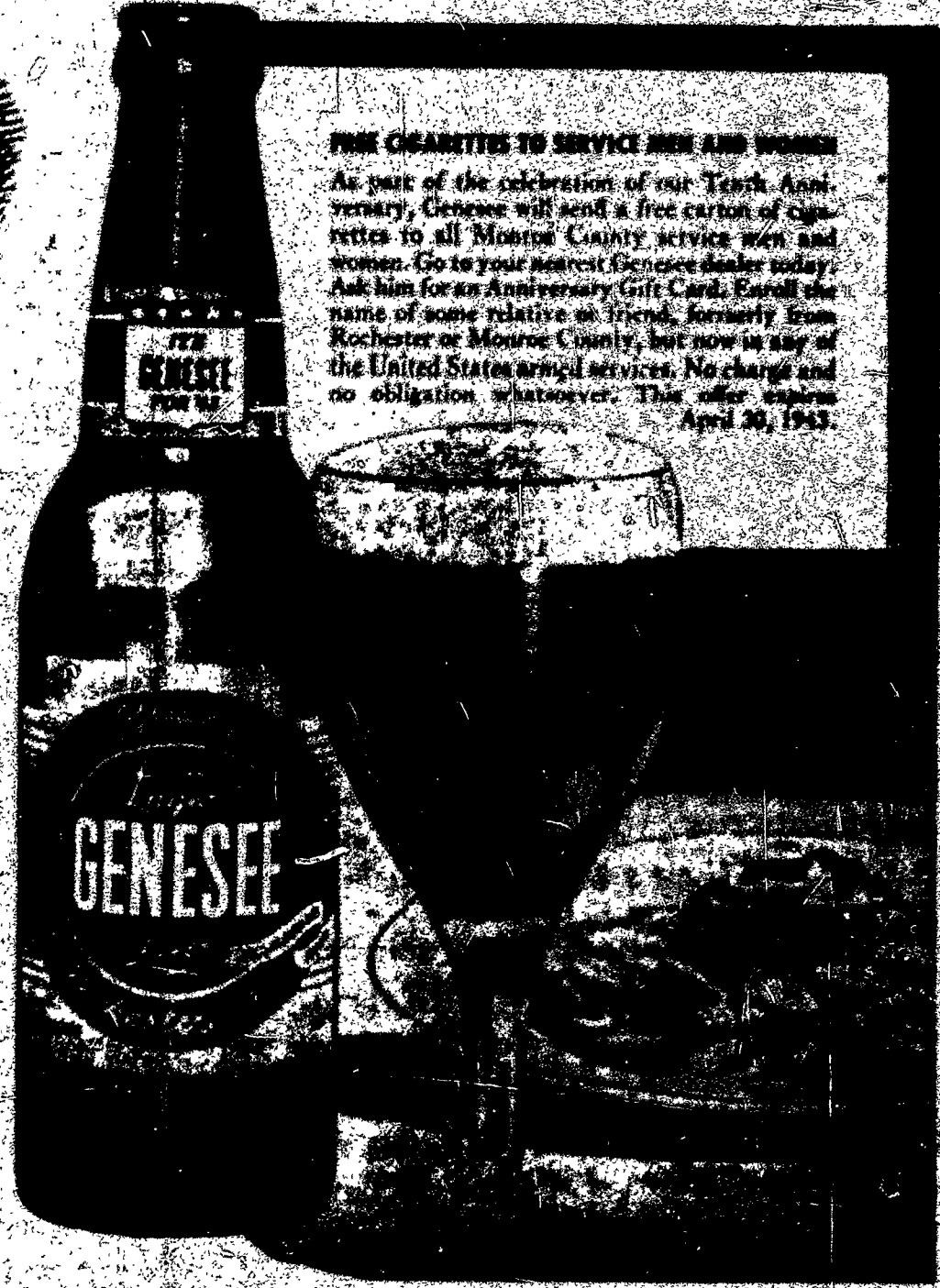
