OPA Rules On Used Refrigerators

On the heels of a new dealer regulation governing price ceilings and sale conditions of used refrigerators which is expected to release several thousand units held in dealers' stocks since May, 1942, OPA today announced a tightening of controls on the sale of used refrigerators by individual householders.

Effective Apr. 15, household sales will come under price ceilings for the first time. Under the old regulations, price control over used refrigerators was confined to the trade and private owners could sell these units at any price they could get. New ceilings will be the same for householders as for dealers.

This action is aimed primarily at resale at exorbitant prices.

Cost have appeared in the trade and that have encouraged abundant household sales at exorbitant prices in areas of acute shortages. Similar action was taken last summer against used typewriters and more recently in controlling used vacuum cleaners. Used washing machine prices will now be regulated in the same manner.

Deters and price control is also incorporated in retail resale of refrigerators. Maximum retail prices for the most popular price classes: refrigerators are fixed at \$225 to \$425 monthly with a delivery and pick-up charge of \$15 allowed under the regulation.
