ON THE HOME FRONT

A Cinderella Chair Steps Out Here is how you can play Fairy Godmother to a kitchen chair. Pad the back as shown here, using at least three layers of cotton batting for the front of it and one for the back. Next, cut an eighteen-inch circle of cardboard and use it for a pattern for marking the shape of the round seat on boards or plywood. Cut out the wooden seat and screw it to the chair. Sew the cardboard pattern.



Cover the front of the chair back next, tufting it with covered buttons sewn through the back with a long needle. Sew the back of the cover in place with stitches hidden under webbing. Tack a strip of muslin around the seat, and sew the ruffles to it. Now, pin the round cardboard, stretch covering fabric over it; then sew it in place on the chair.
