GENEVA—An ecclesiastical exhibit opened on Monday afternoon at the Historical Museum on Main Street and will continue through the week at the regular Museum hours, Tuesday evening and Wednesday and Friday afternoons.

The exhibit consists of vestments and altar furnishings from St. Stephen's, St. Francis de Sales, St. Peter's and St. Michael's Churches, some coming

from England, Russia, Italy and Spain. There is a beautiful carved baptismal shell from the River Jordan territory, a set of embroidered vestments, three hundred years old from Italy, coins and gold and silver medals from Spain and the Indies and a miniature altar completely furnished.

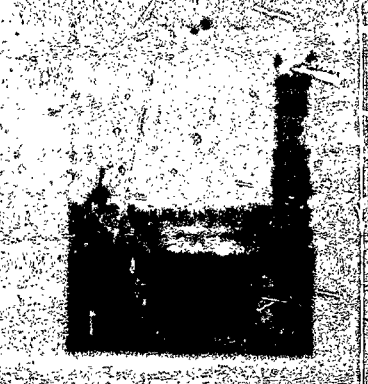

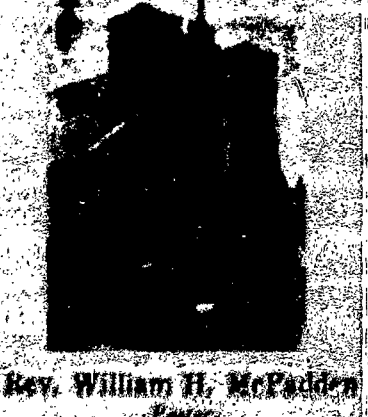
