OPA Rules On Used Refrigerators

On the heels of a new dealer regulation governing price ceilings and sale conditions of used refrigerators which is expected to release several thousand units held in dealers' stocks since May, 1942, OPA today announced a tightening of controls on the sale of used refrigerators by individual householders.

Effective Apr. 13, household sales will come under price ceilings for the first time. Under the old regulation, price control over used refrigerators was confined to the trade and private owners could sell their units at any price they could get. New ceilings will be the same for householders as for dealers.
