Exhibit Of Church Articles At Geneva Museum Wins Favor

GENEVA - The ecclesiastical exhibit at the Geneva historical museum which has attracted much attention was closed on Friday, April 9. The array of vestments, chalices, altar furnishings and other articles was most colorful and varied.

Among the articles connected with church worship, there was a silver chalice given to Trinity church in 1842. And one very attractive display was a handsome "Book of Remembrance" with memorials designed and hand-drawn by hand illuminated by Miss Elaine Wood and previously given to Trinity Church.

Aside from these special exhibits there was also a number of new articles on display recently acquired by the museum. One was a beautiful Florentine silver chain and cross willed to the museum and another was a Korean pipe given by the Rev. Felix White of Geneva, a member of the Maryknoll Mission order, who was a missionary in Korea until forced to return with other expatriated Americans aboard the liner Gripsholm last summer.

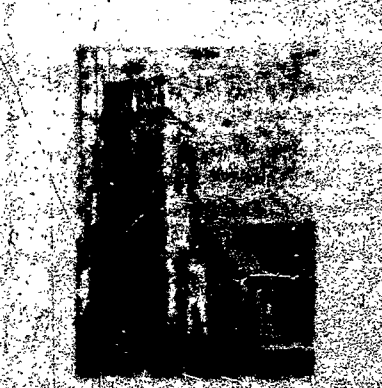
