With a museum display of shoes that have been in vogue since 1890 as the feature event, G. Romeo and Son, shoe firm, is observing its ninetieth anniversary in the retail shoe business.

Together with the museum costume, which was heralded with extensive advertising in neighborhood newspapers, was shown an excellent stock of shoes for men, women and children that are up-to-the-minute in style.

Gottsch Ranch and his son, Charles, are members of the firm, which was founded by the former in St. Paul Street in 1890. Within two weeks from its beginning the building in which it was housed was burned along with the stock of merchandise. But that did not daunt the founder. Shortly afterward he had another new store in the vicinity, but this was outgrown within a few months and another move was necessary. The present store, a modern structure, is the fifth location of the firm.

Young people will enjoy a night or two at what was once an up-to-the-minute merchandise as the beautiful show window showing today was part of the message of the firm to its customers who come from many sections of the city to see the old display and to buy new shoes.
