

### U.S. BISHOPS' GIFT AIDS BRITISH IN SERVICE

LONDON.—Members of the British armed forces, men and women of all denominations, will benefit from the social work to be carried on with the gift of \$100,000 which the Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York and Military Vicar, presented in the name of the Bishops' War Emergency and Relief Com-

mission of the United States during the recent war here. Archbishop Spellman made the presentation to the Most Rev. Edward Mean, Vice-Chancellor of the Archbishopric of Westminster. The money is to be allotted at the discretion of the Bishop Myers and Lady Matheson, a representative body of the American Catholic Committee for British Relief.

### Interned in France, Two British Girls Make Religious Professions

LONDON.—News of the probable fate of two British girls in internment camps in France has reached home. The Catholic parents in North

London have heard that their daughter, who became a Catholic seven years ago and went to a convent at St. Eusebe, France, three years later, has made her

religious profession at the camp at Vichy. Her parents have written that "such news gives them much cause for joy and hope." In the same camp, where a party from the United States is reported to be staying, two other British girls have made their professions as a result of their internment. The news is being reported by the Associated Press.
