CHURCH UNITED
IN GERMANY SAYS
HITLER'S NEPHEW

A portion of the Catholic Church
in Germany, and especially in
the southern provinces,
was shown by Father Hilber,
and of Hitler's half-brother, Alois,
and an Irish mother, following his
lecture in the lecture room in
St. Joseph's Church on Sunday, April 18.

After the lecture in the
lecture room in St. Joseph's
Church, Father Hilber,
said that he had an opportunity
to observe the growth of the
Nazis in the class room of St.
Joseph's, in 1933, when Hitler
was elected as president of the
German Reich. He said that he
has been able to do with the
Nazis in the class room. Persecution
is still underway. He says
with the church by a girl with a
mother — but we shall see in the
end who is the winner," said his
young relative.

Attorney Max at St. Joseph's
Church in Germany, he noticed
that a priest would preach for two
or three weeks, and then be heard
in more or less. And is certain
that always in the churches, Catholic
and Protestant, to listen for
criticism of the party. He spoke
also of the struggle of many young
men to reconcile the Nazi ideology
with that of the church. They are
devout Catholics, receiving the
Sacraments regularly, but they say
that the Church should keep separate
from politics, not realizing
that the Church must of necessity
be involved in the working of a
plan that affects the life and morals
of her members.

Hitler Spectacle
An audience of 1200 jammed the
auditorium, many standing during
the lecture while others listened to
a broadcast in lecture rooms outside.
They heard Mr. Hitler discuss
his relationship with the German
Fuehrer at some length, with
the story of his visit to the home-
land of his father in 1933. He gave
a vivid description of the Party
Congress in Nuremberg in that
year, a spectacle that not even Max
Hilber could have thought of.
He said that he had waited for hours
for the appearance of Hitler, of
Bavaria, and bands playing
at a vast battery of searchlights
making a cathedral in the sky;
then lights out, while the bands
played Deutschland ueber Alles, a
muffled roll of drums, and a
single needle of light playing on the
bushes.

He heard the oratory that has
bedazzled Germany; the promise
to weld Germany into an invincible
block of steel to tear up the
Versailles treaty, to make Germany
German again, this in a
parade of words which
20,000 young Storm Troopers
listened to in a sort of ecstasy.

Later years saw the Nazi machine
claiming to have done more
for Christians in a few years than
the Christian Church had done in
a thousand. The rise of the new
German religion questioned the old
belief in a Jewish Christ, with Hitler
offering as the man to whom
they owed devotion — a new Jesus
Christ, with the Bible abandoned
as an instrument of the Jewish
capitalistic plan for the world.

Questioned in the discussion afterwards,
Mr. Hilber declared that, though
Germany morals is the worst
in the world, the Nazi machine
will continue to function until the
very last minute, since any revolution
could not arise from the powerless
people — only from a dis-
satisfied military. The German belief
in a clear complete victory in
